Context

Historical Note

After the wartime split of the international socialist movement and the foundation of the Communist International (COMINTERN) the remnants of the Second International held four conferences 1919-1920, formally under the auspices of the International Socialist Bureau (ISB); finally at the Geneva conference 1920 only seventeen parties were represented, including the British Labour Party, the (Mehrheits-) Sozialdemokratische Partei Deutschlands (MSPD) and the social democratic parties of Sweden, Denmark, Holland, Belgium and Poland; the same conference decided to move the secretariat from Brussels to London as the Labour and Socialist International; reconciliation with both the COMINTERN and the left-socialist International Working Union of Socialist Parties (IWUSP) failed in 1922; merged with the latter at the International Socialist Congress in Hamburg 1923 in the Sozialistische Arbeiter-Internationale (SAI, also called the Labour and Socialist International).
